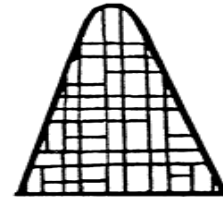

What is "worship in the Taize style?"

Taize is a Christian community in France. It is intentionally ecumenical and has developed a strong music and worship tradition. Each year thousands of people travel to be part of this community of Christian living.

The elements of a worship service in this style include songs, scripture readings including some sung Psalms, silent meditation and prayers of intercession. Each Wednesday we will focus on one of these themes:

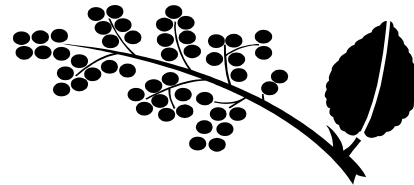

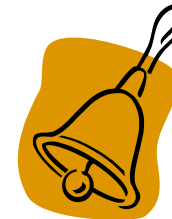

## *Mission & Outreach*

Our country is in the midst of an economic crisis. Individuals, families, businesses, and non-profit organizations have been negatively impacted by the current state of the economy. North Decatur is no exception. This is a congregation that traditionally has gone out into the world "to serve, work for peace and justice, and share God's love with all people." Benevolent giving has always been a high priority at NDPC. Unfortunately, this year's budget constraints are limiting what each of the mission and outreach committees are going to be able to give. The committees are faced with hard decisions regarding what organizations to support and how much to give to those that will be supported. In the coming issues of the Communicator, we will highlight different organizations that we have supported in the past. Please help any of these organization as you are able – with either you time or financial resources.

The first organization that we are lifting up is the **Presbyterian Peace Fellowship**. Founded in 1944 to provide support for Presbyterian Conscientious Objectors to war, PPF celebrates its 65<sup>th</sup> birthday in 2009. Over the decades the work of PPF has grown to embrace and apply the nonviolence of Jesus on a wider range of issues. "But, whether we were opposing nuclear weapons or Saturday night special handguns, ...whether we were standing with Colombians or standing against more wars than we can count, one thing has remained constant: the commitment to conscience--to the "still small voice" that calls us back from violence and war." (from the Winter 2009 Briefly newsletter)

Five years ago the Colombia Accompaniment Program was started to provide a nearly continuous presence of solidarity with the courageous Presbyterian Church of Colombia. This ministry provides support to the Colombian Church in the midst of continued violence as it seeks to remain faithful to Christ's good news of life in its fullness. Accompaniers (one of whom is our own Bob Leslie) go in pairs to experience life alongside our sisters and brothers in Colombia, to learn about their reality and their faith, and to share their stories here in our churches.

## **Creation Care Sunday April 26, 2009**

Last year on Creation Care Sunday, Nelda, along with 14 others, built a rain barrel under the instruction of Jon Watts-Hull. It is a 50-gallon plastic drum with a hole near the bottom for a spigot and a hole in the lid for the downspout.

After some hired help from a handyman to properly attach our downspout, which toppled over when I slid it out of the gutter, I cut off about a four-foot section and slightly enlarged the hole in the lid so our big downspout would fit in it. The rain barrel sits on three cement blocks so that there will be enough elevation for gravity to drain it from the side of our house to the front yard. I attached a 20-foot section of garden hose and we were in business. It fills from one-quarter of our roof (we have three other downspouts) with less than a half inch of rain.

I have since attached a hose to carry the overflow away from the foundation, at the suggestion of our son Mike. That's an improvement over the original downspout.

One early benefit was the discovery of a dozen goldfish swimming in the rain barrel before we installed the lid (probably courtesy of our young fun-loving neighbors). This rain barrel will be on display this year on Creation Care Sunday and many of you will be able to build one just like it from looking at it, as our son did (goldfish not guaranteed!)

### **Ecumenical Advocacy Days Faith Seeking Peace Workshop Washington, DC \* March 13-16**

The NPDC Peace & Justice Committee is building a delegation to represent NDPC at the 7th annual Ecumenical Advocacy Days in Washington, DC. EAD, sponsored by the Presbyterian Church USA and many other faith communities, offers education, training, and lobby visits on Capitol Hill. This year's theme is Enough for All Creation. Workshop tracks include Global Economic Justice, Eco-Justice, and Peace & Global Security. A registration fee of \$160 (\$175 after 2/13) includes two lunches and a Sunday reception. The conference will be held at the Hilton Alexandria Mark Center where a special room rate is available.

As an official EAD pre-event, WAND will lead a workshop on the new 3rd edition of its Faith Seeking Peace curriculum, a valuable resource used in previous Sunday School classes at NDPC. A registration fee of \$20 for this half-day workshop includes materials and refreshments.
