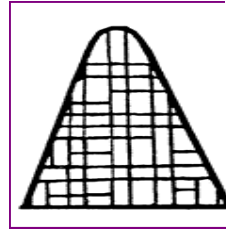

"Taking Your Church to the Next Level"

Sponsored by the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, the Rev. Dr. Tom Tewell, Director of Macedonian Ministries led a seminar at the Morningside Presbyterian Church on Saturday, January 23, which focused on ways in which churches can grow--spiritually, numerically, and in mission to the community. Carol Tveit, Nancy Shober, and Joel Alvis attended from NDPC. Many interesting and provocative ideas and actions plans were shared by both the presenters and participants. Carol and Nancy would like to share with members of the congregation, as they did in church on the day following the seminar, a sampling of what they heard. Session welcomes your comments.

From Carol Tveit:

There was great energy and enthusiasm at the Macedonian Ministries meeting at Morningside Presbyterian Church on January 23rd of this year. Churches attending ranged in size from 100 members to 2600 members. As we examined ways to take our churches to the next level, we listened to the strategies of many churches that have taken themselves to the next level.

Twelve Keys to an Effective Church by Ken Callahan were:

1. Specific, concrete focused Mission Objectives
2. Pastoral and Lay Visitation
3. Corporate, Dynamic Worship
4. Significant Relational
5. Strong Leadership Resources
6. Streamlined Structure and Solid, Participatory Decision Making
7. Several Competent Programs and Activities
8. Open Accessibility - location and traffic
9. High Visibility - active in community
10. Adequate parking, land and landscaping
11. Adequate space and facilities
12. Solid financial resources

How do we at NDPC "measure up" using these criteria? During this period of transition we have the opportunity to do some self-examination and renew our commitment to the mission of our church. It is important that we maintain a staff to help us achieve our mission. Let us as members of the NDPC faith community determine what we will do this year and when we will have it done.

From Nancy Shober:

The seminar also touched on many, many thought-provoking questions that are key in developing the Vision and a plan of action. Of particular relevance for NDPC immediately are:

- Where is NDPC in the life cycle of the church? Is it time to change trajectory?
- Do the pastor and the congregation really want the church to grow—remembering that growth involves change and all changes involve some losses—not necessarily just in membership, but perhaps more significantly, in influence held by various individuals or groups. It must also be remembered that change occurs even when there is no plan for it. But unplanned change does not necessarily lead to growth.
- Is the church prepared to analyze the facts behind changes that have already occurred so that the proper solutions can be developed?
- Will questions and feelings on all sides of issues be given due consideration?
- How can the strong vital groups that already exist within NDPC be more interconnected, making our message to community more coherent?

According to the proverb--- A journey of 1,000 miles begins with a single step. So--- In addition to thinking through the Vision statement, NDPC might want to consider, as some other churches have, a Single Step for 2010. Here are just a few of the many Examples of Creative Initiatives to Grow their membership and community influence that are being taken by different churches as their “Single Step for 2010”,

- Holding a Plant and Seeds Sale and Swap Day for the community which also provides opportunities for visitors to tour the church gardens and facilities
- Interacting with the community organizations that routinely use the church facilities
- Creating hospitality in the polling place during elections
- Making available business cards for the Church, which members can pass out to friends and acquaintances (with mission statement on the reverse side)

Your input will be significant as we move ahead this year, so please use these thoughts as a springboard for sharing your ideas with Session.

Report of Session's 2010 Budget Meeting on January 31, 2010:

The meeting opened with the good news, received with great appreciation, that pledge increases during the past three weeks from members of the congregation and Session have amounted to \$54,000. Pledge receipts for 2010 will be about \$453,200. Additional revenue, as usual, comes from a variety of other sources. The 2010 budget is based on Total Revenue of \$496,567.

Very prudent expenditures and successful fund-raising by the Educational Committee helped bring the 2009 budget in with a net shortfall of \$10,600. This is far less than the shortfall of \$27,400 projected in the budget approved last year for 2009.

For 2010 the objective in establishing the budget was to maintain expenditures at the levels of 2009 to the extent possible.

For that reason, a major consideration was Personnel. In the case of NDPC, staff costs are about 70 percent of the total budget. [Note: In many organizations, costs related to personnel are the largest single component of expenditures.] At issue primarily was whether or not to increase staff salaries, this year by 1% (although in previous years the increase has been in the 2-3% range). Some felt that this minimum amount would indicate to the new pastor that the church cares about its staff in spite of the difficult financial times and it would also be good for the morale of the staff who continue to make significant contributions to NDPC. Others thought that it was not appropriate to give any increase in a year when members of the congregation are unemployed or may have received salary reductions in their own jobs and those on social security have received no increase, and particularly when the congregation dug so deeply to re-commit its pledge amounts after Session re-opened the stewardship campaign. Session voted to keep salaries at their current levels for 2010.

Another major consideration was funding benevolences, which includes Mission and Social Concerns (managed by committees with broad participation among congregation members) as well as Denominational Benevolences. Session decided to target total benevolence giving to 10.8 percent of total revenue. This is in line with NDPC's 2009 actual giving. Additionally, the heads of four committees (Community Ministry, Peace & Justice, Global Mission, and Creation Care) will meet jointly to prioritize how to allocate the funds in order to reduce redundancy.

These decisions, resulting in total expenditures of \$509,517 and a projected net loss in 2010 of \$12,950, were not made lightly. The two-and-a-half hour meeting concluded with unanimous approval of the budget which will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 7, and with the recognition that NDPC has to identify and work to develop areas for revenue enhancement.

Giving a Little Bit Greener in 2010

Beginning in 2010, NDPC will no longer be giving weekly offering envelopes to each pledging unit. Only 12 of about 100 pledges are on a weekly frequency. Most pledges are monthly (or quarterly or annual). In addition to the cost of the envelopes, this led to lots of envelopes being recycled or thrown away!

In order to assist the counters and contribution posters, each pledging unit is being assigned a permanent contribution ID number. For folks with envelopes from this year, this is your current envelope number. Please place this ID number on the memo line of all of your check contributions to the church! However, don't worry if you forget your number, we'll look it up and post your contribution to your account.

If you did not have envelopes in 2009 or have forgotten your envelope number, look in the narthex beginning on Sunday, January 3 for a letter that gives your ID number.

If you requested envelopes for 2010, look in the same spot for an envelope containing pledge reminder coupons for each period that a pledge payment is due (weekly, monthly, etc) along with your ID number. These can be inserted into a pew envelope with your check (or cash).
